

Eight-Line Draw

3-12 players / Print single-sided on US Letter at 100%.

You need: pencils, scrap paper, scissors, 60-second timer.

Print both pages once. Cut the 12 scene cards on page 2, shuffle face down. Give everyone scrap paper.

- 01 Choose a willing drawer and a different timer keeper. The timer keeper also guesses. Play six rounds, changing the drawer each round; repeat willing drawers if needed.
- 02 The drawer privately takes one card. They may exchange it once without revealing either card. Return the unused card to the bottom. Keep all other cards hidden.
- 03 The drawer has 60 seconds to draw the whole scene using at most eight straight line segments. A line is one straight stroke between two endpoints. A corner uses another line even if the pencil stays down. Lines may cross or touch. No curves, letters, numbers, shading, miming or spoken clues. Count the segments aloud as you draw.
- 04 When the drawer stops or time ends, each guesser or pair writes one guess in 30 seconds. Keep guesses quiet. A blank is a pass. If the drawing has more than eight segments, the round is an unscored practice round; nobody loses points.
- 05 Read guesses, then reveal the card. A correct guess names both subjects and their relationship. Ordinary synonyms count: a flag on a tent and a tent with a flag mean the same scene. A partial match does not count. The drawer checks against the card; an unresolved guess stays unscored.
- 06 The table earns one shared point if at least one guess is correct, up to six points in six rounds. There is no individual winner or tie to settle. Stop early whenever you like. Anyone may pass drawing or guessing with no point deduction.

With 7-12 people, one draws and the rest form pairs, with one trio if needed. Each pair or trio submits one guess; rotate who writes.

Twelve scenes, eight lines

Cut on the rules below. Shuffle face down; play six rounds. Draw both things and their relationship.

01 A flag on a tent	02 A kite above a boat
03 A ladder beside a tree	04 An arrow through a diamond
05 A house on a hill	06 A triangle inside a house
07 A mountain behind a house	08 An arrow under a bridge
09 A lightning bolt above a roof	10 A fence beside a tent
11 A star above a mountain	12 A diamond inside a square

Only the drawer reads the current card. Use scrap paper for drawings and guesses. A corner counts as another straight segment, even without lifting the pencil.
